World Vision will be presenting "Keys of Hope", an exhibition that examines the impact of HIV/AIDS on children in countries affected by the disease.

The exhibit will feature art, stories and photographs created by children from World Vision's programs. The display will incorporate Canadian art and sculpture designed to support the children's contributions. Visitors will be encouraged to respond with messages of hope through words or art of their own. The messages will be sent to the children who created the original art.

Stephen Lewis, Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for HIV/AIDS in Africa, will be at the launch of the exhibit on November 17 to speak to students and members of the media. The exhibition will be featured at two locations:
